DIETZEL FATHER, DAUGHTER EXHIBIT AT LOUISIANA STATE EXHIBIT MUSEUM

Secretary of State Jay Dardenne and the staff of the Louisiana State Exhibit Museum are announcing the "Red River to the Sea: Landscapes and Landmarks of Louisiana and Charleston" exhibit opening in the museum's west wing gallery on Saturday, Sept. 28 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. This unique art exhibit takes an interpretative journey around town with former Louisiana State University football coach Paul Dietzel and his daughter, Katherine DuTremble, both recognized artists, visiting some of Shreveport and Bossier City's historic landmarks and Louisiana landscapes.

Dietzel's recollections describe his own participation in high school and college sports, as well as his stint flying B-29 missions over Japan during World War II. His postretirement endeavors have included watercolor painting and providing color commentary for television.

A native Louisianian, Katherine DuTremble began painting in the plein aire style at age seven. She studied for a Bachelor of Fine Arts in printmaking at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. She also studied under the direction of Martin Ahrens, a fellow Louisianian and well known painter instructor, and credits him for teaching her to see the color of light. Now residing in Charleston, S.C., monotypes and oils with vibrant colors and dramatic lighting occupy much of her private studio time.

Dietzel will also sign copies of his new autobiography, "Call Me Coach: A Life in College Football," soon to be released by LSU Press.

The public is invited to view the exhibit through Nov. 30 during regular museum hours: Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday, noon until 4 p.m. The museum is located at 3015 Greenwood Road, between Hearne and Jewella Streets.
